
I would like to present the wonderful 6D's.

Samuel Mood - "I loved it when my buddies passed the ball to me".


Joshua Murray - "I done a high kick, I got awards, and my team scored lots of goals".


What a great season we had, the players are to be congratulated on their commitment and their steadily increasing performance throughout the year culminating in a nail biting last match against the minor premiers.
